Can a conventional cereal drill rival a precision maize drill for crop yield and quality?

Plots have been drilled to make this direct comparison. **The Aim?** To reduce the number of cultivations, work soils less, reducing compaction and improving soil structure, thereby reducing soil and nutrient loss to water. The subsequent reduction in establishment costs is also a benefit to farm profitability.

The event will focus on:

- **Establishment methods – Plough, Min Till, Direct Drill with Conventional and Cereal drill**
- **Wide and narrow spacing**
- **Assessment of yield potential and quality**
- **Concept of inter-row grass drilling**
- **Establishment of Cover Crops post-harvest**
